## Distinguished Alumni



#### **EDWIDGE DANTICAT**

Acclaimed writer and MacArthur Fellowship winner, Edwidge Danticat began her writing career at Youth Communication in 1984 as a 14-year-old writer. In 1987 she wrote a powerful account of her immigration experience from Haiti, "A New World Full of Strangers." Much later, she wrote an introduction to *Starting with I*, a Youth Communication anthology of personal

essays by teens. In this introduction she credits Youth Communication for providing the space from which she would embark on her writing career.

Edwidge said, "At 14 I was asked by Youth Communication to write about my experience as a new immigrant for their publication YCTeen...my public writing career began. When I was done with the [immigration] piece, I felt that my story was unfinished, so I wrote a short story, which later became a book, my first novel: Breath, Eyes, Memory. . . Writing for Youth Communication had given me a voice. My silence was destroyed completely, indefinitely."

Edwidge is a graduate of Barnard College and holds an MFA from Brown University. Today, she teaches at Columbia University and continues as an acclaimed and prolific writer of novels, nonfiction, and books for young adults. Her second book, *Krik? Krak!*, was a finalist for a National Book Award, as was her investigation into the death of her uncle in Miami's immigration jail, *Brother, I'm Dying*. Her first book, *Breath, Eyes, Memory*, was an Oprah's Book Club selection.

She is a 2009 MacArthur fellow, a 2018 Ford Foundation "Art of Change" fellow, a United States Artists Fellow, a two-time winner of The Story Prize, the winner of the 2018 Neustadt International Prize, the 2019 St. Louis Literary Award, and the 2020 Vilcek Prize for Literature.

# Rising Star



#### ORUBBA ALMANSOURI

One of Orubba's stories as a teen writer at Youth Communication was "University of Kitchen?." This story was a plea to her father to break Yemeni tradition and allow her to attend college. She was able to write that story because of her work with her highly skilled editor here at Youth Communication.

Orubba's father did agree; she eventually graduated as salutatorian of City College

and gave a commencement speech. The impact rippled outward as more than a dozen of her girl cousins followed her example and earned high school or college degrees. After the commencement ceremony, Orubba was invited by the former First Lady, Michele Obama, to speak at the United State of Women Summit at the White House, on the "Let Girls Learn" Panel.

Orubba said once, "A simple conversation has the power to change the mind." On May 30th, we celebrate her work elevating and promoting immigrant youth voices in NYC.

Orubba is a doctoral candidate in Urban Education at the CUNY Graduate Center. She holds an M.A. in Near Eastern Studies from NYU. She is an author, educator and researcher. Her interdisciplinary research experience, and her experience as a language learner and immigrant youth prepared her to work as an educator across disciplines with students from various cultural, linguistic, and academic styles.

As a researcher and educator Orubba's work explores cultures of care in school settings that are co-created by the community members including its students. Her recent book chapter focuses on the experience of schooling for Yemeni Youth. She holds the Provost Enhancement Fellowship from the CUNY Graduate Center and has held multiple fellowship awards including the FLAS Fellowship from NYU and the Mellon Mays Undergraduate Fellowship.

Through her work, Orubba aims to push forward the importance of multicultural education in transforming academia into an environment where immigrant students are able to connect and thrive in the world that revolves around them. She is currently teaching at Barnard College at Columbia University and at Baruch College.

## CYPRESS HILLS LOCAL DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION

Youth Communication (YC) and Cypress Hills Local Development Corporation (CHLDC) have worked together since the 1980's. For more than 25 years, CHLDC's youth participants improved their literacy skills by reading YC's print magazines - which center youth stories and voices.

The partnership grew in 2017 as YC began training CHLDC's staff to use YC's social and emotional learning (SEL) curricula to create supportive learning environments that strengthen social and academic skills. Staff currently use YC's stories and lessons across CHLDC's 11 middle school sites. CHLDC have also collaborated to create youth-run community improvement projects based on YC's stories.

Cypress Hills Local Development Corporation serves more than 200,000 residents from the neighborhoods of East New York, Cypress Hills, City Line, Starrett City and Spring Creek. CHLDC offers programs in: career & education, college success, community development, youth & family services, community organizing and housing counseling.

YC deeply appreciates CHLDC's commitment to making youth voice a centerpiece of its youth development efforts and looks forward to continuing this partnership.


