## TERMS TO KNOW

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#### Sex Assigned at Birth:

A designation a person is assigned at birth and which is recorded on an infant's birth certificate, if such a certificate exists. A New York City birth certificate can include M (male), F (female), or X (non-binary, gender expansive, gender-neutral, etc.).

#### **Cisgender:**

An adjective describing a person whose gender identity is the same as their assigned sex at birth. For example, an individual who was assigned female at birth and whose gender identity is female.

#### Transgender:

Describes a person whose gender identity and/or gender expression is different from their assigned sex at birth. For example, an individual who was assigned female at birth and whose gender identity is male.

#### **Non-binary:**

A person who identifies as neither male nor female. These individuals may go by they/them or ze/hir pronouns, or another gender-neutral pronoun.

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#### **Sexual Orientation:**

An individual's actual or perceived romantic, physical or sexual attraction to other persons, or lack thereof, based on gender. A continuum of sexual orientation exists and includes, but is not limited to, heterosexuality, homosexuality, bisexuality, asexuality and pansexuality. Sexual orientation is not the same as gender identity.

#### **Gender Expression:**

The way a person expresses gender, such as behavior, clothing, hairstyles, name, pronouns, activities, or mannerisms. Gender expression can vary depending on one's culture as well as changes in social norms and expectations, such as shifts in clothing and hairstyles.

#### **Dead-Naming:**

Deadnaming occurs when someone, intentionally or not, refers to a person who is transgender by the name they used before they transitioned.



Ignoring historical movements, biological truths, and gender diverse literature

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
#### NATIONAL POLICY

## SCENARIOS



#### 1) On the first day of school, one of your transgender students is worried about being misgendered and called by their dead name during roll call.

2) You accidentally misgender one of your students for the first time.

3) You notice one of your colleagues referring to an openly out trans student by their dead name. When you correct them, they brush it off saying the student "isn't here right now."

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"There's magic in being seen by people who understand it gives you permission to keep going. Self-expression sometimes requires other people. Becoming ourselves is a collective journey."

4) You notice that one of your students changes their clothes into something more traditionally feminine when they get to school and changes back before they leave for the day.

5) One of your students asks you after class if another student is a "tra-y."

6) A student asks you to use a different pronoun when referring to them in front of their parents.

7) A student defends their classmate when they hear someone misgendering them.
